Yes, I know that the chicken held within its flavorsome crust any number of coronaries; but Lord have mercy, did it hit the spot. With a side order of creamed corn and a buttermilk biscuit to top it off, I was set to get back on the road, or take a nap, whichever came first.

Well, that old man and me sat in silence and filled our bellies for a while, and then the time came to leave. "Sorry, We Don't Make Change for \$50's and up"

Protestations aside, that fellow was unable to convince his rival that a one hundred dollar bill was all he had in his possession. She wasn't about to budge. She put her hands on her hips and made it clear that she would brook no argument.

Well, I had better things to do than watch a thrashing, and from the looks of the waitress it wouldn't be a fair fight anyway. That old man wouldn't stand a chance. So I paid for the tea and the sandwich and the rest, and after bidding my erstwhile companions farewell, I headed on down the road in search of new adventures and fresh tales to tell.

As I drove away that afternoon I had to laugh. You see as difficult as that waitress may have been, she was no less ornery than most of us most of the time. Somewhere hanging in your heart as well as mine sits on old yellowed sign, dog-eared beyond all recognition, with the words scrawled upon it:

"I Don't Make Change For Nothing."

Come on, you know I got ya. All kidding aside though, we all know that change is simply part of life. 


